PROJECT NAME: Women's Health Network Literacy and Sensitivity Material Review

DESCRIPTION: During this internship, the student will review the various written materials from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) Breast and Cervical Cancer Control and Navigation Program (BCCCNP) that are delivered by the various county locations of the Women's Health Network (WHN) program. Literacy level, cultural and LGBTQ sensitivity will be reviewed with definite revisions delivered as needed. Specifically, MDHHS client program materials such as informed consent and enrollment forms will be assessed for these priority health equity considerations.

PROJECT DELIVERABLES: The student will engage in tangible health equity measures, reviewing and revising materials that will offer state wide impact. Additionally, the student will have definitive experience and materials to guide future programming. The student will be offered an audience with program officials to further guide effects of health equity conversations.
